It's been a rather quiet fortnight!

FIRE SAFETY

Classes 2 and 4 were visited by Jon from the Devon and Somerset Fire and Rescue Service.

In Class 4 the children learnt all about what to do if there was a fire, including how to contact the fire service and what to say. They also had to spot dangers in the home and make their own fire escape plan.

With Class 2, Jon made links with their topic by discussing the events from The Great Fire of London and told the children how people tried to tackle the blaze in 1666 without a fire service! He talked about how and when we might need to contact the fire service. He then played a 'hot & cold' game about which objects around the home are safe/not safe to touch. He showed the children how to test a fire alarm and they had the chance to dress up in a firefighter's uniform!
